

Middleton Musings

Later this year the UK will host the UN Climate Change Summit possibly in Glasgow or maybe in London. The UN says "The world is in a race to limit climate change. To meet the urgent need to address climate change and achieve the goals of the Paris Agreement The race is on it is a race we can and must win"

As Christians how should we respond, what guidance do we have to hand. During the period of the current magazine we will see Spring transform our countryside and gardens. New growth will abound. But as I write this article it is between storms Ciara and Dennis. Strong winds, heavy rain, flooding and snow batter the landscape. Some of this is not new, but the frequency and severity of extreme weather does seem greater. The last million years has seen a succession of major ice ages interspersed with warmer periods and the last ended 20,000 years ago and we are in an interglacial period of the earth's history. However, it is true the earth is warming due to increasing concentration of greenhouse gases in the atmosphere.

From Genesis humankind was given a role as stewards working with God to tend his creation. It is sad that role has sometimes turned into exploitation and destruction. Another key Christian principal is justice and concern for the poor. It is often the poorest and weakest that suffer most from extreme weather patterns and rapidly changing climatic conditions especially impacting their ability to feed themselves. Look at articles online or in news papers and see how many make climate change claims, but how true are they?

A recent Sutton Coldfield and Aston Deanery Synod meeting voted to be a carbon neutral deanery by 2030. What can and should we do either individually or together? How will what we decide to do or not do impact others in our country and in other countries?

By no means all are regular (or even occasional) churchgoers, but deep within ourselves there is a hereditary knowledge of these ancient seasons and the desire to pay some attention to them. Lent has already begun by the time you read this; we had a service for the whole parish at Wishaw on Ash Wednesday (26th February). But it is not too late for you to join in. Details of services and other events at our three churches can be found elsewhere in this magazine. If you have decided to give something up good for you, I hope you can do it! As always, a reminder that if giving up whatever it is will save you money, you might think of donating some either to the church or to your favourite charity or you might decide to do something extra. For example, a group of singers from Middleton, with others, are going to put on "The Way to the Cross", music, spoken words and visual images very suitable for Lent, at Middleton Village Hall on Sunday 29th March. Please come along if you can, and if you would like to take part details of how to do so are elsewhere.

On four Sunday evenings at 7:45pm a Lent Study called 'A Passion for Christ' will be held in Curdworth Church Hall. The Sundays are 1st,8th 15th and 22nd March. I can assure you that these discussions are not as stiff and starchy as they might sound, please give them a try. There will, of course, be Mothering Sunday services at all three churches on 22nd March.

Above all keep in your minds the many people who have worshipped God and observed Lent in these three villages over hundreds of years. Most lie forgotten, but in their day they kept the faith and played their part in the inheritance we have. Let us maintain and increase it for their sake.

Sunday Lunch at Grounds Farm



VACANCY UPDATE

In the last issue, we had pencilled in interview days for the appointment of a new Vicar for our Parish. These took place on 20th and 21st February. The new format allowed opportunities for the Clergy and Readers to meet the candidate, for the candidate to see the three churches and villages, for the panel to join in worship with the candidate and chat together over food, as well as discuss mission and ministry. In addition, around 60 more people, drawn from the congregations and community groups, were able to meet the candidate during an evening event designed to give everyone a chance to chat in a social setting. The two days gave the candidate the opportunity to experience something of the life of the Parish and decide whether this was the right place for the next phase of ministry. It also gave at least a cross-section of people the opportunity to meet their potential new Vicar in advance of the formal interview day and feedback to the Parish Reps their responses and reactions.

Statement from Ven Simon Heathfield, Archdeacon of Aston

"Thank you to everyone who helped organise the discernment process last week as we continue our search for the next vicar. The Patronage Board and the Bishop are continuing to work through the process with the candidate who came for interview. This involves various checks and issues before a formal announcement can be made. Please continue to pray for that work and listen out for further news."

Thank you to everyone who attended the evening event on Thursday 21st February and for the feedback which we received. Thank you to Isabel Potter and Vicki Wright for leading on the catering arrangements for Thursday and Friday, all of which ran very smoothly, and to the people who supported by providing food and also helping on Thursday throughout the day.

They were tough days for the candidate and his wife—and us! We now have to wait for the 'checks and issues' to be resolved, after which we will be able to make a 'formal announcement'.

Curdworth Poetry Reading Group

Most of you will be aware that I have had a couple of sessions of Chemotherapy, but you will not all know that, in addition to my iPod of music of all kinds which I take with me while being treated, I have also taken with me a book or two of poetry to help pass the time. There is one poem that haunts me whenever I think of the poetry I love and identify with which has in it two exquisite lines where the arrangement of the words used is just perfect, the absolute epitome of the poet's art. The poem is one of Kipling's (Nothing to do with Mince Pies!) and is entitled "The lost road through the Woods". You may recall Kipling wrote a very well liked poem "IF"). The two lines in particular are: "Where the night air cools on the trout ringed-pools, And the Otter whistles his mate" There is something about these two lines that speak volumes and paints a perfect picture of the night time scene Kipling is describing. The whole poem consists of just two 12 lined stanzas.

We have tended to become embarrassed about Kipling in the last 50 years because of his background in British India before the first world war. We shouldn't be, Kipling wrote good poetry and he was a man of his time, born into a relatively privileged family but acutely aware of the hardships of the poor and particularly of the private soldier out in the stifling heat of India.

I have printed the entire poem here for those readers who do not have access to the internet (you only need "the night air cools" in Google!).

If you too like this poem maybe you would like to commit it to memory – a stanza each week for two weeks? The Poetry group members have a copy of an article by Dr Martin Scurr (Daily Mail) who reports on the findings of repeated surveys into the importance of keeping our brains active, it seems that committing poems to memory is one of the easiest ways of maintaining our grey cells, the act of "recalling" the words to mind in the correct order is a valuable exercise.

The Way Through the Woods—Rudyard Kipling

They shut the road through the woods
Seventy years ago.

Weather and rain have undone it again,
And now you would never know

There was once a road through the woods
Before they planted the trees.

It is underneath the coppice and heath,
And the thin anemones.
Only the keeper sees
That, where the ring-dove broods,
And the badgers roll at ease,

There was once a road through the woods.

Yet, if you enter the woods
Of a summer evening late,
When the night-air cools on the trout-ringed pools
Where the otter whistles his mate.
(They fear not men in the woods,
Because they see so few)
You will hear the beat of a horse's feet,
And the swish of a skirt in the dew,
Steadily cantering through
The misty solitudes,
As though they perfectly knew


