


<u>ANTHEMS from the Choir:</u> On Sunday 28th May the Choir will be singing "Come Holy Ghost, our souls inspire". The tune is described as 'Proper Sarum Melody'. The words are styled 'after Rabanus Maurus (circa 776-856). On **Sunday 4**th **June** the anthem is "God so loved the World", text from St John's gospel,

chapter 3 and music by John Stainer (1840-1901). It is well known as part of Stainer's "Crucifixion".

SYMBOLISM......From Easter and the cross, we have experienced a whole sequence of events dripping with symbolism and vibrant imagery. It is interesting to see how artists have depicted events such as the Ascension, usually showing the figure of Jesus disappearing heavenwards with the astonished disciples watching. How would <u>we</u> describe Jesus' migration from earth to heaven – as somehow fading before the disciples' eyes? Beyond description?

What about Pentecost? How do you put into words or show in a picture what happened when the disciples received the Holy Spirit? We have the descriptions in the Acts of the Apostles in the Bible and visual images, music and drama to help us to understand what is truly beyond our understanding. We do know that whatever happened, it was life changing. Imagine being in that house where the disciples were sitting:

"And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability."

The devout Jews in Jerusalem thought the disciples were all drunk! Peter defended them and said they were not drunk, for it was only nine o'clock in the morning. They were not filled with wine, they were filled with the Holy Spirit. In the quotation above, the sound and the tongues are compared to the nearest elements they could think of to explain the inexplicable, but after this momentous experience, prophecy was fulfilled and about 3,000 new converts to Christianity were baptised in the name of Jesus Christ and themselves received the Holy Spirit.

Almost before we have had the chance to digest all of this, we are presented with another tricky concept – the Holy Trinity – God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Those words can be found at the end of many of the Collects, the prayer for the day. The image on page 1 shows how the three manifestations of God are intertwined – our Father in heaven, his Son who was born as man and who died to save us and his Spirit who is with us always. What a support system to help and sustain us through the worst times and to rejoice with us in the best

Readings for Sunday 28th May 2023

Pentecost

Collect

God, who as at this time taught the hearts of your faithful people by sending to them the light of your Holy Spirit: grant us by the same Spirit to have a right judgement in all things and evermore to rejoice in his holy comfort; through the merits of Christ Jesus our Saviour, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Amen.

New Testament Reading

is from the Acts of the Apostles chapter 2

¹When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place.

²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

⁵Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. ⁷Amazed and astonished, they asked, 'Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? ⁹Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, ¹¹Cretans and Arabs – in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power.' ¹²All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, 'What does this mean?' ¹³But others sneered and said, 'They are filled with new wine.'

¹⁴But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them: 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. ¹⁵Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. ¹⁶No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

17"In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams.
18 Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy.
19 And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist.
20 The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day.
21 Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

Second Reading

is from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians chapter 12

³No one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit.

⁴Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; ⁵and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; ⁶and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. ⁷To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. ⁸To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, ⁹to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, ¹⁰to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. ¹¹All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

¹²For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body Jews or Greeks, slaves or free and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. Glory to you, O Lord.

¹⁹It was evening on the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' ²⁰After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. ²¹Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' ²²When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'

Collect

through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

The Old Testament Reading

is from the book of the prophet Isaiah chapter 40

¹²Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand and marked off the heavens with a span, enclosed the dust of the earth in a measure. and weighed the mountains in scales and the hills in a balance? ¹³Who has directed the spirit of the LORD, or as his counsellor has instructed him? ¹⁴Whom did he consult for his enlightenment, and who taught him the path of justice? Who taught him knowledge, and showed him the way of understanding? ¹⁵Even the nations are like a drop from a bucket, and are accounted as dust on the scales: see, he takes up the isles like fine dust. ¹⁶Lebanon would not provide fuel enough, nor are its animals enough for a burnt-offering. ¹⁷All the nations are as nothing before him; they are accounted by him as less than nothing and emptiness.

Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel,
My way is hidden from the LORD, and my right is disregarded by my God?
Have you not known? Have you not heard?
The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth.
He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable.
He gives power to the faint, and strengthens the powerless.
Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted;
but those who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength,

they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.
